Further afield at the Matterley Bowl, on 12th May there are the Gauntlet Games in aid of Naomi House and Jack's Place and then over the first weekend in June there will be the British MotoCross Grand Prix. Again, a little bit of extra vigilance would not go amiss, though both events do try and keep people onsite once they arrive there by providing all the facilities they should need.
