We have been advised that the number of Police and Police Community Support Officers in Alresford will not be affected, but there will inevitably be a change in the way the Town and surrounding villages are policed, so perhaps this is an appropriate time for Neighbourhood Watch to become more flexible in its communications to everyone and a move to a monthly article is the first step.

Crime Prevention

In recent months a significant number of thefts have occurred from sheds, garages, outbuildings and also unlocked cars. It is therefore worthwhile ensuring valuable tools, machinery, bikes and garden equipment is security marked and properly secure. Firstly a good padlock will help to deter opportunistic thieves whilst alarms, either mains or battery operated, are worth considering, along with CCTV.
